The colours of the frieze

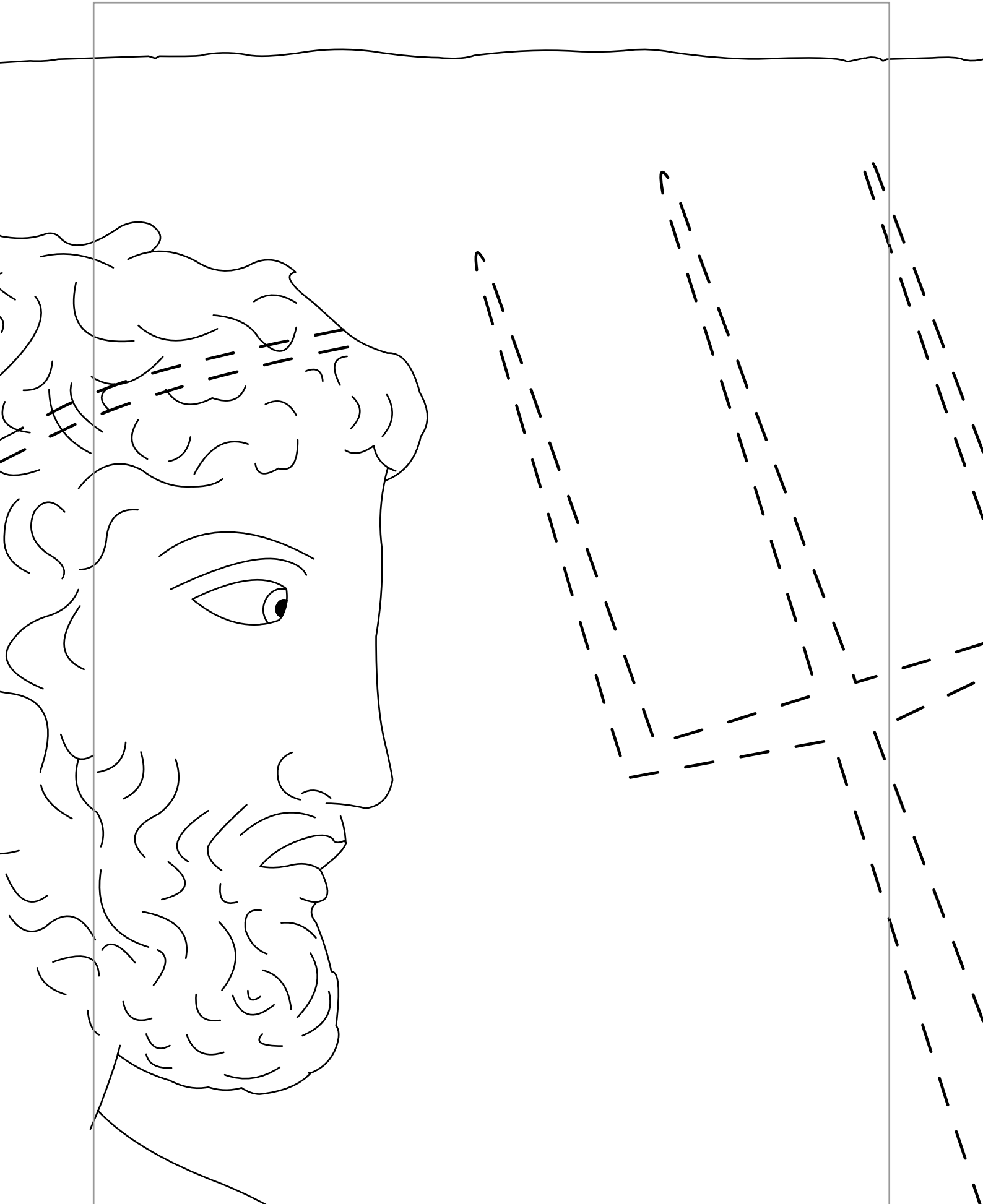
The frieze was painted with wonderful colours. Red, blue, green, yellow and gold were some of the colours used by the ancient artists. The temple was thought to be completed only when its sculptures were also painted. Become an ancient painter and choose your favourite colours to bring the frieze to life.

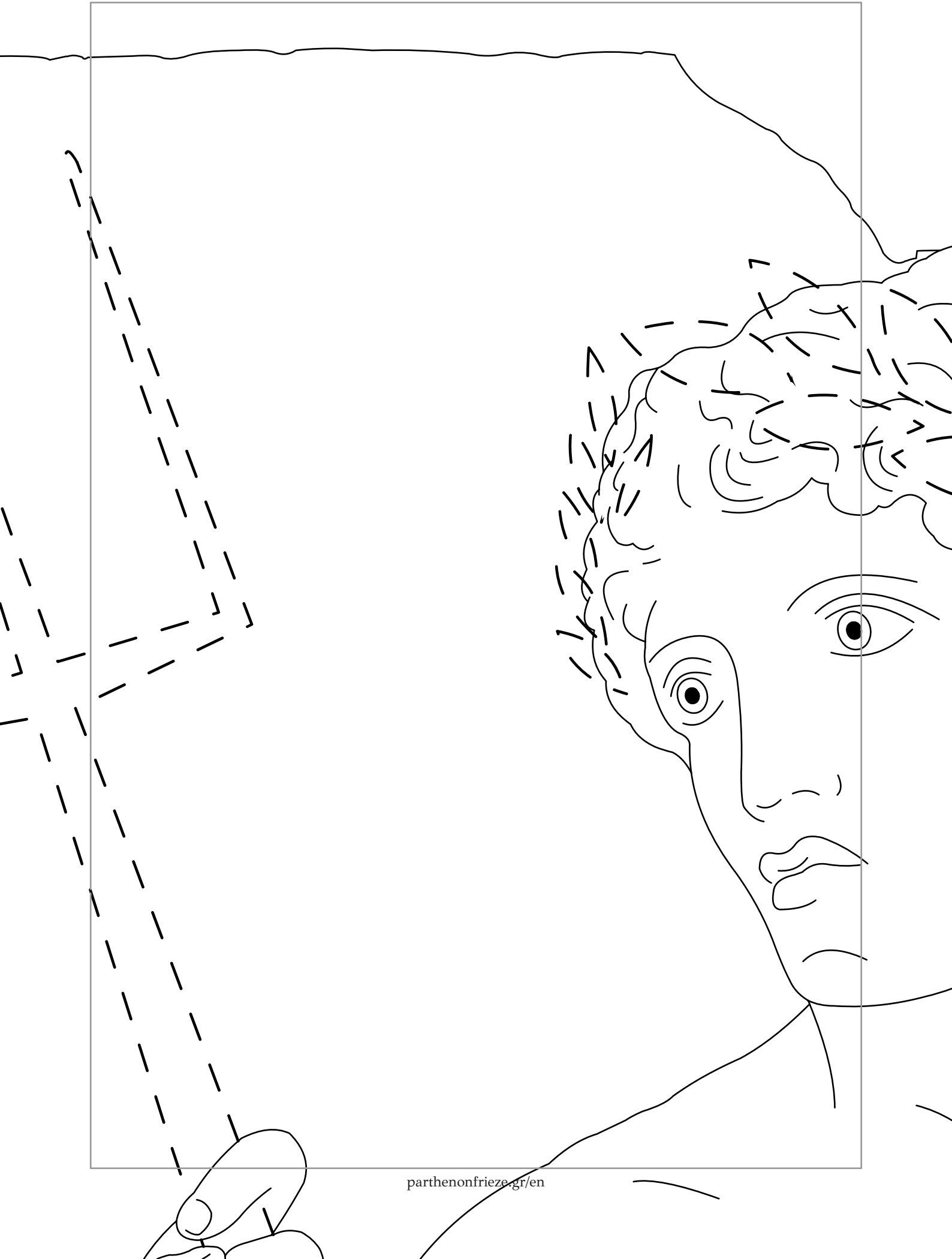
Print all the pieces of the block depicting the gods and distribute them to the pupils to decorate them as they wish. Then join all the pieces together to see the actual size of the block.

Notice in the drawing the details shown in dotted lines. They were additional elements to the figures made of metal or painted on the marble, which are now lost. They include ribbons and hair wreaths, thongs on sandals, ropes that bound animals and symbols held by the gods.





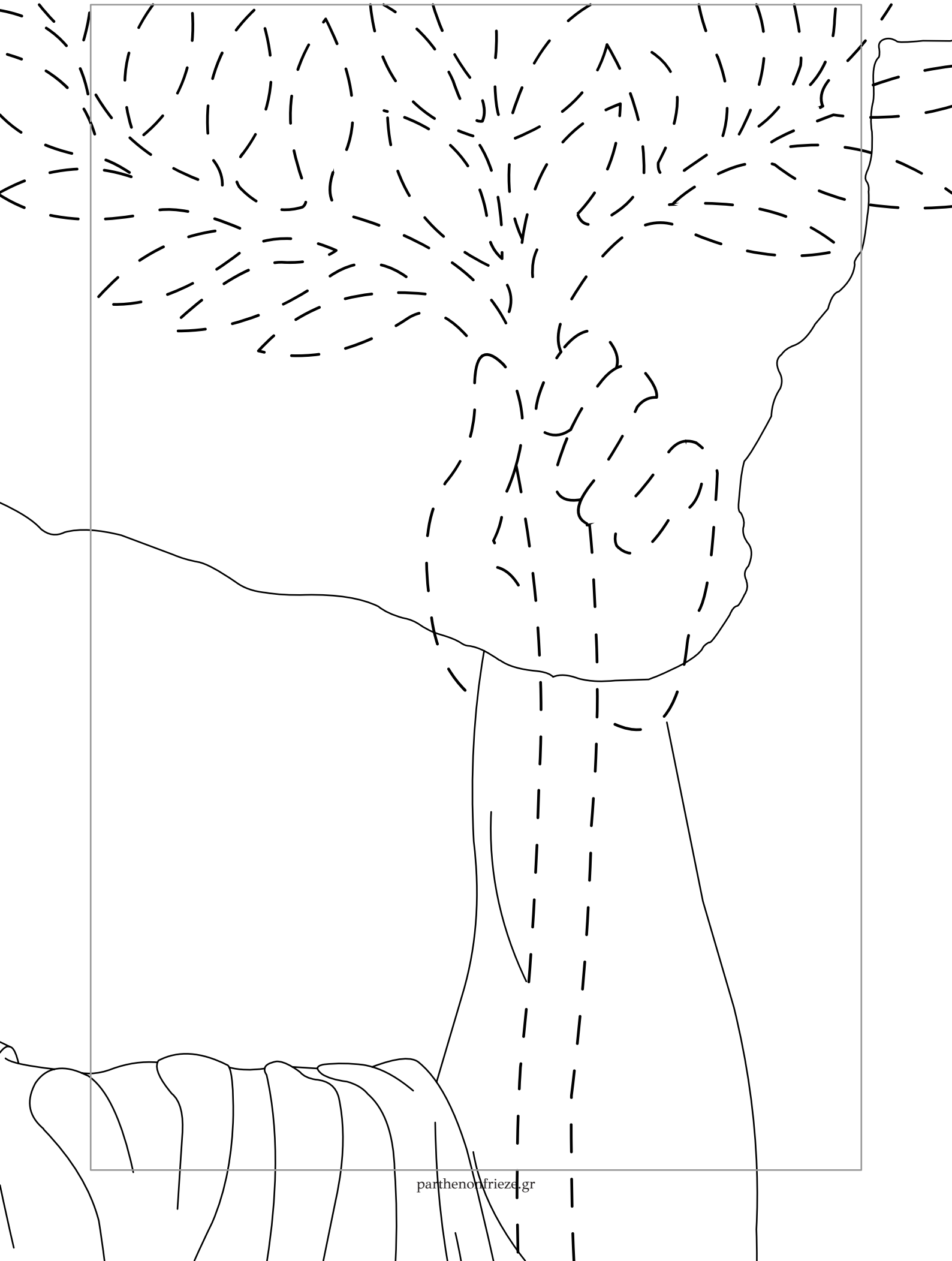






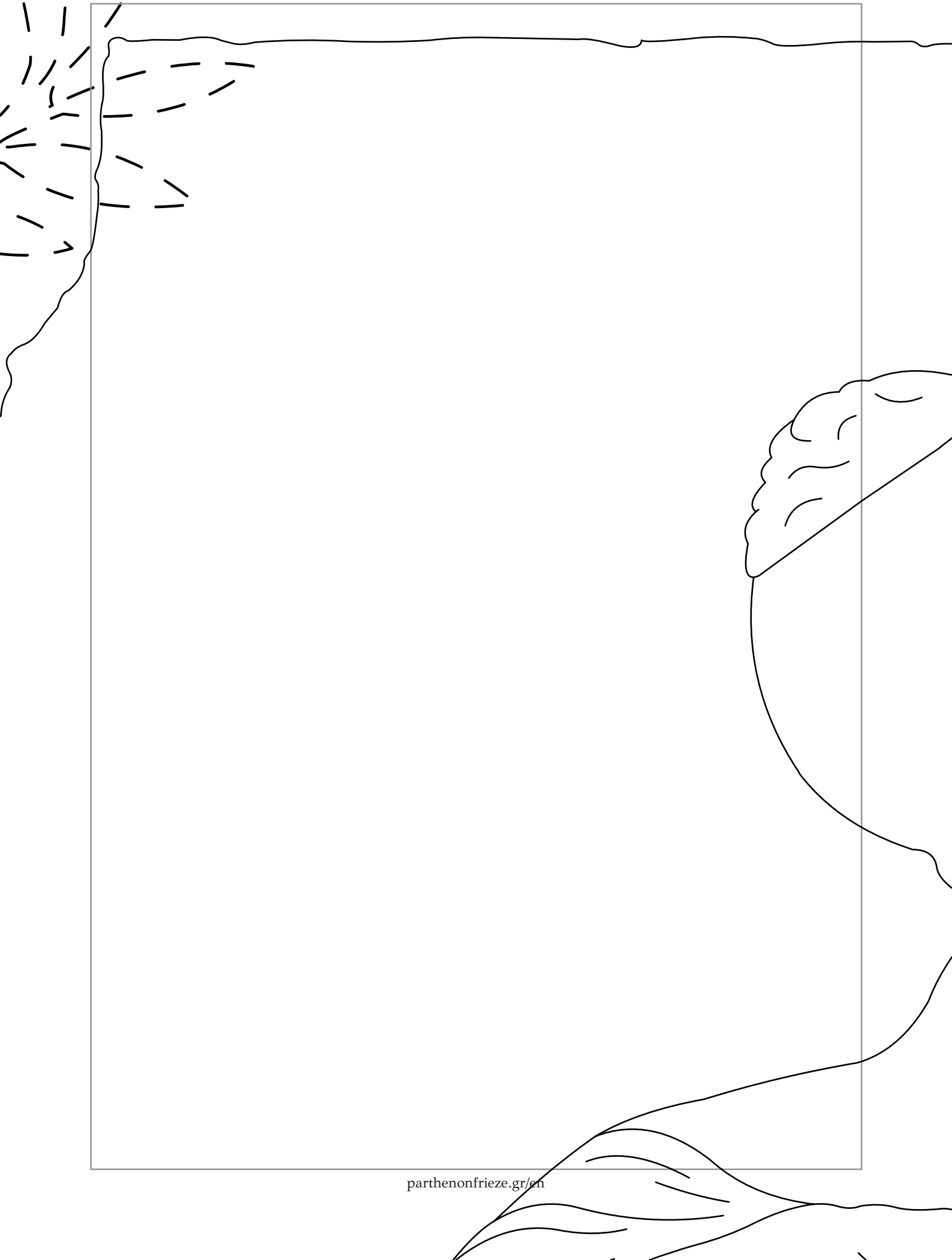
